When I've probed deeper I learned some people have traveled and made arrangements individually, stayed in hotels, or condos, and have not had the people-to people, one of a kind experiences people have in Friendship Force that aren't available to tourists.

Some people indicated they wanted to meet people from other cultures. Others felt secure having group experiences planned by Friendship Force people in their clubs, and being hosted by them. Most people believe it is less expensive to travel through Friendship Force than individually.

I was drawn to Friendship Force, because I believe in the mission of breaking down barriers between cultures and promoting understanding and cultural education. I learned first hand through a group of Egyptians, and a group of Russians who visited that our participation in Friendship Force activities with people visiting from other countries does indeed make us "citizen diplomats" who can make a difference in how people perceive one another. We can find common ground despite differences. I've learned it can, and should be fun.

There are so many ways to enjoy Friendship Force. It is definitely not a one size fits all, and it may vary from year to year depending on the mix of people and their ideas and efforts. Members have choices to participate locally in any creative ways they wish, or with our in-bound or out-bound journeys in different ways. Some people enjoy and are able to go on a journey to another country and see things through a different lens by meeting and being hosted by others in that culture.

Others may wish to concentrate on meeting and sharing with people visiting our country. That is possible in a variety of ways, such as by attending a welcome or farewell party for the visiting group, or hosting someone in your home, or not in your home but acting as a day-host. In that role you pick up a visitor(s) from where they are staying and participate with them during the day on a part of the itinerary and then bring them back to where they are staying at the end of the day. Perhaps you could host a small dinner party. You may enjoy getting to meet or sponsor international students through our JAG (Judge Advocate General) Program.

These are examples, but not an all inclusive list. We welcome new ideas. There are so many opportunities to get involved with local social events and have fun with other members, or join in and help at a Fundraising event. You'll be discovering many ways to participate locally throughout the year. No matter why you joined Friendship Force, we want your participation and input to make our club enjoyable.






