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

Thank you so much for hosting the Medicine Hat Friendship Force Club and arranging a wonderful program. You highlighted a good selection of historical sites in your area. We learned a lot about the role of past American presidents in the formation of the government and the cultural life of not just Virginia but the country as well. We admired the beauty of the green landscapes: the trees, the fields, the flowering plants. We explored history dating back to 1607, through the American Revolution, the Civil War to the present. The councillor of your City Council enlightened us about the operation of your local government. While we learned more about the roles of several early presidents, that of James Madison was particularly enlightening as our knowledge of him was more obscure than the others. His role is of particular interest to us Canadians since he was president during the War of 1812. There appears to be some controversy as to who actually won it. Now the Americans believe they won the war. The Canadians believe they won the war, especially since they were able to fend off major attacks by the Americans. Generally though, Canadians accept the end of the war as a standoff. It did have an important effect which was the establishment of the world's longest undefended border between the USA and Canada: the 49th parallel. After that Canadians and Americans could work on becoming friends again.

So again, thanks to your ED, Bob, and Dee for arranging this exchange, to those who hosted, and everyone else who helped to make this exchange a success. You made us feel so very welcome! Cheers,

2016 Inbound: A Nation Divided – America's Civil War

There currently are 19 ambassadors registered for this September exchange, a mix of both international and domestic folks. As we go to print we have 10 members/couples who will be hosting the ambassadors and I am very happy to say the group includes five new member couples to include Robert and Joanne Harris, John and Brenda Alluisi, Ranny and Ulli Reynolds, Dave and Lynn Wirth, and Wayne and Betsy Brady. On behalf of the Board of Directors and the membership, a big "thank you" to all of them and to the rest of you who stepped forward to host. And of course thanks also to you other members who have volunteered to act as day hosts or otherwise participate in the exchange. Our plan is to have a "hosting orientation" latter this month for our new members and of course a couple meetings of all of you involved in the next two months before the exchange. Also, we will be publishing details of the exchange in the next Ambassador and hope all of you will be able to participate one way or another.

2016 Inbound: Open World Program – Tajikistan

We are still working our way through defining what will be expected of our club in terms of hosting this event. To repeat, we will be hosting a small (7 or 8) delegation of folks from the country of Tajikistan who will be staying with us to learn about the electoral process here in the US. We envision this will include visits to local and state government organizations, possibly the University of Virginia, and other organizations involved in the electoral process. New member Bob Harris has agreed to act as Exchange Director for the exchange but we are in the process of putting together a committee of "seasoned" members to work out the details of the who, what, when, and where aspects of the exchange. Rob Beck has volunteered to work with FFI to learn more about what will be required. Information will be disseminated to the club membership as we work our way through this.

2017 Outbound: Mondo Maya de Tuxtla Gutierrez, Mexico

As previously reported, the Mexican club has agreed to change the date of the exchange to April which is great news as the weather then is much better than August! Deborah Winslow will be ED for the exchange; we now have up to 10 members who have stated they want to participate and since this is a joint exchange as I previously reported we may have to establish a waiting list, depending on how many slots we are given. 2017 Outbound

We are still hoping to establish an outbound exchange with Santa Barbara, CA in 2017 but this is still being coordinated. Other domestic exchanges may be possible. We are also talking with Medicine Hat, Alberta to see if we might be able to work out and exchange with them next year, more info on that in the next Ambassador.

2017 Inbound

Nizhny Novgorod and Kirov Oblast, Russia, November 2017: Nothing new has happened in regards to this exchange As previously mentioned, we have let FFI know we have no objection to hosting ambassadors from the two clubs and I will be contacting the EDs to work out details. More info to follow.

Themed exchange: As previously reported, FFI has requested we host a three or four day exchange sometime in 2017. We have suggested possible themes of "Central Virginia's Early American Presidents", "Wineries & and Micro Breweries of Central Virginia", and "The Civil War in Central Virginia". More details to follow in the coming months. We have yet to hear from FFI on this but will pass on the information once we hear from them.

We Will Miss You, Freddie

I am sad to announce that Freddie Bacher is moving to Denver, Colorado in August to be closer to her family. She has actively participated in all of our clubs activities, her favorite being hosting the JAG students.

Frederica Sterling Bacher was born 84 years ago in Dublin, where her father, a career diplomat, served as the first appointed minister (ambassador) to the Irish Free State. The Sterling family was very happy to welcome a daughter after three sons.

Historically, her family hails from the mid-west where they prospered as business people. Her father's career enabled the family to live in many places. Her earliest memory, at age 4, was of the sounds made by horses' hoofs on the cobble-stoned streets of Washington D.C. as the milkman delivered milk, as well as ice, to the local families each morning. Freddie spoke French before she learned English.

Her education began in Washington, D.C., then a boarding school in Philadelphia P.A., followed by high-school at The Madeira School in Northern Virginia. She obtained her degree in 'Art History and Studio' from George Washington University in D.C.

Freddie worked as an interior decorator, a French teacher, and also taught modern dance. Her father's career took the family to live in Ireland, France, the Baltic States and Sweden. While in her early twenties, after traveling for 3 months around the world on her own she later drove solo to Mexico, where she resided for a year and a half, and learned to speak Spanish.

In 1960, she married Kurt Bacher, an Austrian electrical engineer and the family grew to include two sons and a daughter. His work took the family to live in Switzerland, Colombia and Germany. Freddie recalled her scariest time as being in Bogota, Colombia where her husband, her obstetrician and Freddie, who was in active labor, drove to several local hospitals trying to find one that would allow her husband to attend the birth they finally did find one!

After leaving Germany, they decided to live in the USA, the Bacher family settled in Orange VA on a 120 acre sheep farm. Due to some economic difficulties, Freddie returned to school, became a registered nurse, and worked at Martha Jefferson hospital where she put her Spanish to use, serving as an 'on-call translator'. She retired at 79 years of age.

Regarding her children, her eldest son who lives in Annapolis MD, is a Merchant Marine and Naval reserve Captain, her youngest son, a resident of Denver, is a vice president of a company that processes organic oils for beauty product. Her daughter is a stay-at home mom and a devoted wife.

We will miss you Freddie! You certainly led a global life and were a great Ambassador for America, just as we, members of Friendship Force try to be on our outbound international exchanges. I hope that you take away some sweet and wonderful memories from your time with The Friendship Force of Central Virginia. We wish you the best of everything!




