A Nation Divided - America's Civil War

As we learn more about the registration and details we will keep you posted. While we are scheduled to host part of this exchange, it is open to our members to participate in it as well. If you are interested in being an Ambassador, please contact me for information.

Exchange Committee

As part of FFCV Inc.'s reorganization a new committee known as the Exchange Committee was formed and at present I am the committee chair. The Exchange Committee chair and those on this committee are responsible for developing exchange programs for the Club and the coordination of inbound, outbound and multi-club exchanges. In short, the committee will handle the Club's efforts to schedule and coordinate future exchanges with FFI and make initial contact with the other clubs involved. Once an exchange has been scheduled and coordinated, the committee will relinquish all responsibilities and involvement in the exchange to the Club's Exchange Director (ED), once that individual has taken responsibility for the exchange. At present I have been working on one exchange scheduled for 2016 and for outbound and inbound exchanges currently scheduled for 2017. The statuses of the exchanges are as follow:

A Nation Divided: America's Civil War: The multi-club Civil War-themed exchange scheduled for Sep 20 – Oct 9 is coming together and at least 10 ambassadors have signed up; a maximum of 20 and minimum of 15 are required for the exchange. Our portion of the exchange will require four nights' homestay and members can sign up for the entire exchange. Once we know how many ambassadors

will be participating we will start looking for home hosts and others willing to participate. Bing Spitler will be the ED for our portion of the exchange.

2017 Outbound: Mondo Maya de Tuxtla Gutierrez, Mexico: I and the Des Moines, Iowa club ED have requested FFI change the date of the exchange (originally scheduled for July) be moved to April. FFI sent an email to the Mexican club requesting same on Feb 18th, but I have not seen their response. Deborah Winslow will be ED for the exchange; up to 11 members have stated they want to participate and since this is a joint exchange we may have to establish a waiting list, depending on how many slots we are given. Please contact Deb if interested.

2017 Outbound: Domestic: We are still hoping to establish an outbound exchange with Santa Barbara, CA in 2017 but this is still being coordinated. Other domestic exchanges may be possible.

2017 Inbound: Nizhny Novgorod and Kirov Oblast, Russia, November 2017: We have let FFI know we have no objection to hosting ambassadors from the two clubs and I will be contacting the EDs to work out details. More info to follow.

2017 Inbound: Themed exchange: FFI has requested we host a three or four day exchange sometime in 2017. We have suggested possible themes of "Central Virginia's Early American Presidents", "Wineries & and Micro Breweries of Central Virginia", and "The Civil War in Central Virginia". More details to follow in the coming months.

This is the major fund raising event for our club and we appreciate your helping us.







Theme: A Nation Divided - America's Civil War Dates: 9/20/16 - 10/9/16

FF Greater Harrisburg, Pennsylvania (5 nights home hosting):

- The exchange begins with a Welcome Gala and "Civil War Ball" led by Victorian Dancers.
- The historical significance of Harrisburg and the railroad during the Civil War.
- Tour the National Civil War Museum.
- Gettysburg National Civil War Battlefield tour with a National Park Guide to learn about the 3-day battle. Stop at the Civil War Cemetery where President Lincoln gave the Gettysburg Address.
- Lecture by the associate director of the Civil War Institute and Underground RR historian.
- Tours at historical locations that provided a refuge for Freedom Seekers along the Underground Railroad.
- Tour a farm that was used as a Civil War hospital during the Battle of Gettysburg.


- Tour Antietam/Sharpsburg battlefield, the bloodiest battle on American soil w/author, Bing Spitler
- European-style Sunday brunch at the <u>Bavarian Inn</u>

- Tour the <u>Lee Chapel</u> on the campus of Washington and Lee University where General Robert E. Lee served as university president after the Civil War and where Lee, his family and his beloved horse, Traveler are buried.
- Walking tour and museum at the Virginia Military Institute
- Lunch at the Greenbrier Resort with Civil War history provided by local historian.

FF Charleston, West Virginia (2 nights lodging with day/dinner hosting)


- Tour state capital of WV and listen to lecture "WV becomes a State" and "Kanawha Campaign"
- Southern style lunch and tour of the <u>Craik Patton House</u>, home of a Confederate commander killed in battle at Winchester. Grandfather to Gen. Patton WWII
- Tour historic salt works. In the 1800's salt was mined by slaves.
- Tour <u>Glenwood plantation</u>, home of the Summers family who supported the Union during the Civil War. An 1864 Lincoln campaign poster was recently found in the attic of the house.
- Stop at the <u>New River Gorge</u>, Virginia Chapel (served as Confederate hospital and Union Stable during Civil War) with slave cemetery in back, and Kanawha Falls

FF Central Virginia (Charlottesville): (4 nights home hosting)

- Battlefields and the significance of the Shenandoah Valley
- Sites and stories from Stonewall Jackson's 1862 campaign
- Massanutten Mountain, the Virginia Museum of the Civil War and New Market Battlefield,
- Fredericksburg, Spotalvania and Chancellorsville battlefield tours and Battle of the Wilderness
- Tour <u>Appomattox Courthouse</u> and grounds where General Robert E. Lee (CSA) surrendered the confederate troops to General Ulysses S. Grant (USA) on April 9, 1865.

- Tour the town and grounds where the siege of <u>Petersburg</u>, <u>VA</u>, location of a series of battles between generals Ulysses Grant (USA) and Robert E. Lee (CSA) during the 9 ½ month Richmond-Petersburg campaign from June 1864 March 1865 including a tour of the Crater.
- Travel by train from Richmond to Alexandria, VA

FF National Capital Area (Washington DC): (4 nights home hosting)

- Tour Arlington National Cemetery and Arlington House (aka Custis-Lee Mansion), Robert E. Lee
- Memorial, and civil war graves including that of James Madison Cutts, Jr.

- Lecture: "The Class of '61 West Point At the Outset of War"
- Tour Ford's Theater Museum where President Abraham Lincoln was assassinated





<u>Call to Order:</u> A quorum being present the meeting was called to order at 10:10am by President Al Colville. All actions taken by the BOD were done upon motion duly made, seconded and followed by discussion, and carried by a majority vote of the Directors unless otherwise noted.

President Colville welcomed everyone and directed Past President Dave Burns to a special chair to show our appreciation for his two years of leadership. He said the focus of this meeting will be to develop a calendar for the year.
