

Trip to See the Terracotta Army

On February 16th the Friendship Force took a trip to Richmond to see the Terracotta Army exhibit at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts. The Terracotta Army is the legacy of the first emperor of China, Ying Zheng. When Ying Zheng died in 210 B.C. he was interred in a mausoleum complex that measures approximately 38 square miles. He was accompanied into the afterlife by an army of nearly 8,000 lifesize clay soldiers, horses, and chariots organized into battle

formation and equipped with a full arsenal of weapons. More than 700,000 workers constructed the mausoleum complex over years of Ying Zheng's reign.

The empire, under Qin's reign, adopted a universal writing system, a national currency, revised weights and measurements, and built a new network of interstate roadways. In only eleven years as emperor, he brought significant political and cultural reforms, unified the nation, and



reshaped Chinese national identity in ways that have resonated for 2,200 years.

After viewing the exhibit, the group stopped for lunch. It was a great way to spend a rainy day!

A flurry of activity is about to begin. There is traveling afoot both coming and going.

Inbound: Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, 18-22 April, 2018

In less than a month the first of several reciprocal journeys will begin. Our friends in Harrisburg will be spending a few days with us in order to experience some of our more interesting areas such as Monticello, Montpelier, the Blue Ridge, and of course our famous wineries.

2018 Outbound: Mie and Ota-Gunma, Japan, May 2018

While Al Colville remains in contact with the hosts at both locations, nothing significant has transpired regarding the journeys. All is waiting to hear from the EDs at both places to determine costs and other information regarding these journeys and will pass that info on. Some of the group is extending their stay in the region with short visits to South Korea and Taiwan.

Inbound: Des Moines, Iowa 13-18 June, 2018

Last year a number of our club members combined with the Des Moines FF club to have a joint journey to Chiapas Mexico and a number of their members requested they visit our club in 2018. So, an agreement was made for us to host them this coming June and to show them some of the places we talked so much about during the Mexican exchange. We expect 14 ambassadors coming on this journey. We will need a number of hosts for this journey so get ready to be contacted regarding the visit.

Outbound: Des Moines, Iowa TBD, August 2018

The folks in Des Moines recommended we visit them in August when the Iowa State Fair is underway (August 9-19) and Des Moines celebrates Restaurant Week, usually in the last half of the month. We still need a few more responses of the Doodle to determine: 1) if you are interested in going; and if so 2) what dates you would prefer. In any case, the journey will be about four or five days.

2018 Inbound: Bundaberg, Australia, 2-9 October 18

As previously noted this journey is in conjunction with the Bundaberg's multi-week visit to the U.S. which will include our club, one in central North Carolina, a few days in Nashville, and finally the FF club in Baton Rouge, LA. At last word, the group should not include more than 16 ambassadors. Like the other inbounds expect to be contacted soon over what role you can play in this journey, i.e. host, day host, dinner party, etc.

We have received our official inbounds and outbounds for 2019.

2019 *Inbound:* FF Flathead Valley, Kalispell, Montana in the spring of 2019.

2019 Outbound: I have not gotten all the specifics yet, but a fall trip to the Sunshine Coast and Bundaberg, Australia and Marlborough, New Zealand has been approved.


