We will shortly be asking members to indicate their participation as hosts. Look for more details as they are available.

2016 Inbound: Open World Program – Tajikistan: As President Colville has announced we will be hosting 5 delegates from Tajikistan, a bi-lingual facilitator, and a translator November 4-12 through the congressionally sponsored Open World Program, which brings emerging leaders from participating countries to the United States in order to give them firsthand exposure to the American system of democracy and free enterprise There will be 15 Friendship Force clubs participating in the program, and the delegates specifically requested visiting our club as Virginia is the Partnership for Peace/National Guard sister state for Tajikistan. More information will follow in the coming months.

2016 Inbound: A Nation Divided – America's Civil War: There currently are 18 ambassadors registered for this September exchange, a mix of both international and domestic folks. Registration cut-off is June 1st and since we are only two ambassadors short of the maximum allowed it appears the exchange will indeed happen. As previously stated our club will be responsible for hosting the group for five days and four nights and we will shortly be looking for hosts and others to support this exchange. Two of the five days are abbreviated with us picking up the ambassadors after 5 pm on Day 1 in Staunton and turning them over to the Richmond club mid-day on Day 5 in Appomattox. Hosts picking up or bringing ambassadors to Staunton and Appomattox, respectively, will be compensated for meals and mileage. Day 2 of the exchange is a "free day" for the ambassadors, but we have offered them the choice of either: a visit to Monticello and Michie Tavern for lunch; or trips to three local wineries and lunch at Trump Vineyards; or a tour of Charlottesville and lunch at the Omni Hotel; or a day of relaxation. The ambassadors will have to pay extra for these activities and we may need day hosts to support them. Please help us make this a great exchange experience!

2017 Outbound: Mondo Maya de Tuxtla Gutierrez, Mexico: The Mexican club has agreed to change the date of the exchange to April which is great news as the weather then is much better than August! Deborah Winslow will be ED for the exchange; up to 11 members have stated they want to participate and since this is a joint exchange as I previously reported we may have to establish a waiting list, depending on how many slots we are given. Please contact Deb if interested.

2017 Outbound: Domestic: We are still hoping to establish an outbound exchange with Santa Barbara, CA in 2017 but this is still being coordinated. Other domestic exchanges may be possible.

2017 Inbound: Nizhny Novgorod and Kirov Oblast, Russia, November 2017: Nothing new has happened in regards to this exchange as previously mentioned, we have let FFI know we have no objection to hosting ambassadors from the two clubs and I will be contacting the EDs to work out details. More info to follow.

2017 Inbound: Themed exchange: As previously reported, FFI has requested we host a three or four day exchange sometime in 2017. We have suggested possible themes of "Central Virginia's Early American Presidents", "Wineries & and Micro Breweries of Central Virginia", and "The Civil War in Central Virginia". More details to follow in the coming months.

FF Greater Harrisburg, Pennsylvania (5 nights home hosting):

- The exchange begins with a Welcome Gala and "Civil War Ball" led by Victorian Dancers.
- The historical significance of Harrisburg and the railroad during the Civil War.
- Tour the National Civil War Museum.
- <u>Gettysburg National Civil War Battlefield</u> tour with a National Park Guide to learn about the 3-day battle. Stop at the Civil War Cemetery where President Lincoln gave the Gettysburg Address.
- Lecture by the associate director of the Civil War Institute and Underground RR historian.
- Tours at historical locations that provided a refuge for Freedom Seekers along the Underground Railroad.
- Tour a farm that was used as a Civil War hospital during the Battle of Gettysburg.

- Tour Antietam/Sharpsburg battlefield, the bloodiest battle on American soil w/author, Bing Spitler
- European-style Sunday brunch at the Bavarian Inn
- Tour Harpers Ferry, WV and Winchester to learn about their significance to the Civil War
- Tour the <u>Lee Chapel</u> on the campus of Washington and Lee University where General Robert E. Lee served as university president after the Civil War and where Lee, his family and his beloved horse, Traveler are buried.
- Walking tour and museum at the Virginia Military Institute


- Lunch at the <u>Greenbrier Resort</u> with Civil War history provided by local historian.


FF Charleston, West Virginia (2 nights lodging with day/dinner hosting)


- Tour state capital of WV and listen to lecture "WV becomes a State" and "Kanawha Campaign"
- Southern style lunch and tour of the <u>Craik Patton House</u>, home of a Confederate commander killed in battle at Winchester. Grandfather to Gen. Patton WWII
- Tour historic salt works. In the 1800's salt was mined by slaves.
- Tour <u>Glenwood plantation</u>, home of the Summers family who supported the Union during the Civil War. An 1864 Lincoln campaign poster was recently found in the attic of the house.
- Stop at the <u>New River Gorge</u>, Virginia Chapel (served as Confederate hospital and Union Stable during Civil War) with slave cemetery in back, and Kanawha Falls

FF Central Virginia (Charlottesville): (4 nights home hosting)

- Battlefields and the significance of the Shenandoah Valley
- Sites and stories from Stonewall Jackson's 1862 campaign
- Massanutten Mountain, the Virginia Museum of the Civil War and New Market Battlefield,
- Fredericksburg, Spotalvania and Chancellorsville battlefield tours and Battle of the Wilderness
- Tour <u>Appomattox Courthouse</u> and grounds where General Robert E. Lee (CSA) surrendered the confederate troops to General Ulysses S. Grant (USA) on April 9, 1865.



<u>Call to Order</u>: A quorum being present the meeting was called to order at 10:05am by President Al Colville. All actions taken by the BOD were done upon motion duly made, seconded and followed by discussion, and carried by a majority vote of the Directors unless otherwise noted.
