In October, 2014, I traveled to Australia and New Zealand on my first outbound trip with Friendship Force of Central Virginia, staying with single women in both countries. The stay with these women as well as the whole trip was totally beyond my expectations – it was fabulous in every way! Not only did I get to experience a little of life in Tamworth, Australia, but also I was able to establish a wonderful friendship with Cathy, my host, in her lovely home. I had my own spacious room and bathroom attached which I loved, and was with a great conversationalist to boot! She drove me everywhere and went to all events that she could. When she couldn't, she arranged for someone else in the club to take care of me. I was wined and dined and treated royally. She even took me to the "dollar" store there before leaving, per my request, so that I could find some inexpensive souvenirs! The whole club there was extremely accommodating, friendly and well-organized and took us too many interesting places that I would never have seen had I visited there on my own or with a tour.

My stay with Diane in New Plymouth, New Zealand, was equally wonderful. Along with having my cup of hot tea ready every morning at breakfast, she made sure that I traveled everywhere with the group, even when she couldn't go, and she had a very comfortable and attractive bedroom and private bath for me, too. I was able to meet her two grade-school-age grandchildren one afternoon

when she needed to be home for them after school, and I had delightful conversations with them. The sheep and cattle farms/ranches we visited were amazing, and our hosts were well-organized and thoughtful as they showed us around the area. Of course, Mt. Taranaki, the center of their area, was spectacular! I was thrilled with Diane's many flower gardens with the unusual plants that I had never seen.

An unexpected bonus from these trips was a visit from Mary of the Gold Coast, Australia. She had stayed in my home a year before when visiting my town with a club from Australia. After my FF stay in Tamworth, she drove 8 hours from her home in the Gold Coast and took me touring around other parts of Oz that weren't included in the Tamworth visit! We went to the Eumundi Market a long ways northeast of Tamworth on Wednesday, the only day it's held, the Margaret Ollie art museum, the Sunshine Coast and then on to Steve Irwin's Zoo outside of Brisbane so that I could see all the unusual wildlife there, including petting a koala and other animals. We ended up at her lovely home in the Gold Coast where I had a nice swim in her pool, and she even hosted a dinner party for me!

I could go on and on, but suffice it to say that this trip was truly a major highlight of my life, and if it weren't for Friendship Force, I would never have had these experiences or met these great people! As a single person, I felt well cared for and treated royally as if I were "family," although I was halfway around the world! I had great companionship in the homes of the natives and on our tours. This is amazing considering all of us were strangers in the beginning. I feel that I was able to meet the ambassador pledge of promoting cultural understanding and friendship. I can't wait to go again!


The Friendship Force of Central Virginia hosted a delegation from Tajikistan for the purpose of giving them in in-depth view of elections in the United States. Among the delegates were heads of the two major political parties, the commissioner of elections, two socio-political research scientists from their university and a Tajik employee of the US embassy in Dushanbe, the capitol city.

Upon arrival the delegation was warmly greeted by the staff of Tavern on the Green at the Spring Creek Country Club where they enjoyed a great lunch and then were handed off to their PGA golf professional, Kevin Haney who treated them to a golf demonstration and allowed them to try their hand at hitting a few golf balls. What a marvelous time they had and it all went to being an unexpectedly great reception for them.

Over the weekend they were treated with visits to the Frontier Museum in Staunton and to Montpelier, the



home of James Madison. There could not have been any more significant activities than those because they received instruction on how the very first settlers formed communities and established the political structure by which the residents agreed to live on Saturday. On Sunday they learned how the Articles of Confederation were used to develop the Constitution and the Bill of Rights. Those activities laid the perfect foundation for then delving into the current day election activities.



They were greeted by the University of Richmond on Monday with courtyard signs of welcome and recognition of their country Tajikistan. After a working lunch learning about the political science activities of the university, they engaged in a panel discussion with the top professors of the political science department.

Upon returning to Charlottesville they were greeted on the downtown mall by Kristin Szakos, a member of the city council. She escorted them to the voter registration office and later greeted them publicly as they attended the Charlottesville City Council monthly meeting.

Election day found our delegation touring one of the larger polling places in Fluvanna County during which they were given demonstrations on casting votes and a detailed explanation of how

the balloting system works. That was followed by a tour of the campus of UVA and a very beneficial meeting with the second in command at the University of Virginia Center for Politics, Ken Stroupe. They also were guests at the coveted watch party hosted by Director Larry Sabato.

Wednesday's activities continued with an in-depth panel discussion with the top political science professors at Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond. For several hours they were able to participate in discussions on the election results and gain an understanding of the historic significance

of what had occurred the previous day. All in all, a totally amazing day for our delegates as they came to the realization that they had actually observed a bloodless revolution during their visit. They knew they had participated in a small way in what will be recorded as part of the history of the country.

The town council of the town of Scottsville hosted our delegation on Thursday and they were given the opportunity to learn about the election and political system of a small town. On Friday, they went shopping and on Saturday they departed to return to their country. Among their parting comments were that they noticed that Americans smiled a lot and were very friendly people. This friendliness was punctuated by the fact that on Wednesday morning some stranger had picked up the entire breakfast check of \$150.00. Everyone was amazed at that.



On November 11th our Tajik guests and several FFCV members attended the Veterans Day Ceremony in Orange, Virginia where they were able to observe a typical small town ceremony featuring the local orchestra playing patriotic music, high school color guard, lead speaker local American Legion Commander Alan Drinkwater (Wilow's husband), and most importantly a large number of local veterans. Larry Moore from the JAG School and several international JAG students also attended the event. Following the ceremony our guests were treated to a visit to the local American Legion Lodge where veterans and they were greeted by throngs of elementary school students lining the road with American flags and more at the Lodge entrance singing patriotic songs. At one point, one of our Tajik guests, Bakhtiyor,joined the children in singing along with them!

2017 Outbound: Mondo Maya de Tuxtla Gutierrez, Mexico: Good news! Friendship Force Des Moines Iowa, the club we are sharing this exchange with, recently passed along they will only be able to send five ambassadors on the exchange, thus we can send up to 15 ourselves. At present we have 10 members interested in the exchange so we can add an additional five ambassadors. If you are interested in participating please contact me or our ED, Deb Winslow, as soon as possible. The exchange will be held 18-25 April 2017, and the Mexican club is willing to set up an additional week add-on at the end of the exchange. The all-inclusive cost for the week long exchange likely will be around \$400-450 per person which includes the Mexican club and FFI fees, and administrative costs. Airfare there does not appear to be expensive as we can fly round-trip Dulles-Cancun for less than \$400 and Cancun-Tuxtla Gutierrez for less than \$200. A Canadian FF club visited Tuxtla Gutierrez last winter and the add-on they participated in included a trip to the El Chiffon Waterfall, the Montebello Lake Zone and the Tenam Puente ruins, Las Numbes - Guacamays, the Ruins at Yaxchilan and Bonampak, Palengue and visiting the Museum La Venta. Their trip included all hotels, including rustic cabins (all reportedly very nice), and seven American style breakfasts and entry to all sites plus a full-time guide and bus. At present, do not know what that program would cost. Again, contact us ASAP if interested.

2017 Inbound: Nizhny Novgorod and Kirov Oblast, Russia, November 2017: I have been in contact with the two Russian EDs (Tatyana and Oksana) and it appears they are very interested in coming here next year. The exchange was discussed at our November BOD meeting and it was agreed to suggest the exchange take place in October, or at the latest in early November 2017, and that we would be willing to host up to 20 ambassadors. This information has been passed to Tatyana and Oksana. Also more good news, don't worry you won't be getting a visit or call from me asking you to be the ED for the exchange as Dale Walden has stepped forward and volunteered to fill the position. A round of applause to Dale!

2017 Outbound: No change since the last newsletter. We are still hoping to establish an outbound exchange with Santa Barbara, CA in 2017 but this is still being coordinated. Other domestic exchanges may be possible. We are also talking with Medicine Hat, Alberta to see if we might be able to work out and exchange with them next year, more info on that in the next Ambassador.

2017 Inbound: Themed exchange: As previously reported, FFI has requested we host a three or four day exchange sometime in 2017. We have suggested possible themes of "Central Virginia's Early American Presidents", "Wineries & and Micro Breweries of Central Virginia", and "The Civil War in Central Virginia". More details to follow in the coming months. We have yet to hear from FFI on this but will pass on the information once we hear from them.

Member News Friendship Force of Central Virginia Loses a Good Friend

Ruhi Ramazani, 88, Edward R. Stettinius Professor Emeritus at the University of Virginia, died on Wednesday, October 5, 2016, at the UVA Medical Center. Called the "Dean of Iranian Foreign Policy Studies" by The Washington Post, the renowned scholar-teacher was devoted to the University of Virginia, to which he dedicated several books, and to the Jeffersonian ideals that it embodies.

Dr. Ramazani was a dear friend of FFCV as well. He and his wife Nesta attended several of our functions and his comments and insights into international events were always welcomed.

Dear Nesta:

It was with great sadness that Dee and I read of Ruhi's passing. Intermingled with our desire to express to you our shared feelings of grief, we also want to acknowledge a like measure of gratitude; gratitude for having had a brief time in the presence of a man of intellect, gentleness, grace and peace.

It was in March of two-thousand and three that we first met. I had been appointed as Chairman of Friendship Force International's Regional Conference to be held in Charlottesville, Virginia. I had read of Ruhi's belief that through respect and mutual dialogue tensions could be reduced between Iran and the United States. Confident in this objective being shared by the Friendship Force creed, I extended an invitation for him to be our key-note speaker. How pleased I was that he accepted!
