Oct 2017 Inbound: Cornwall, England stopover:

As planned, a group of 12 members of the Friendship Force (FF) of Cornwall, England arrived on October 17 for a short stop-over on their way to Washington, D.C. In addition, a member of FF Vancouver, Canada also joined the group. Fellow FFCV members John and Brenda Alluisi, Al and Peggy Colville, Dave and Lynn Wirth, Pam and Paul Hokanson, Dave and Sally Zabransky, Dale Walden, Ann Newmark, and Dave and Linda Burns hosted the visitors. After meeting up with our guests (who arrived in two mini-vans starting out in western North Carolina) at the Comfort Inn at the base of Pantops, we retreated to our homes where we got to know our guests and in some cases participate in small dinner parties hosted by other members. The following day we took our guests to Monticello where they and some members toured in the morning, followed by box lunches at members Helen Ida and Leroy Moyer's house, and in the afternoon took a tour of the original part and downtown mall areas of Charlottesville, sponsored and led by the folks at the Albemarle Charlottesville Historical Society. And oh yes, weather during the entire day was spectacular. The day was finished off with our quests hosting their hosts at Sal's Italian Restaurant adjacent to Lake Monticello where all had a great time, The next morning, on the 19th we all gathered to get our guests back to their vans where they departed for Washington where most of them would be spending a couple of days. Oct 2017 Inbound: Niznyy Novgorod, Russia

As explained in the last Ambassador, due to visa rejections and other issues this was not a sanctioned FF journey, but rather an event with our club hosting only four members of the club who could come to the U.S. as guests or visitors. This did not really matter much as hosts John and Brenda Alluisi, Dave and Lynn Wirth, and Peggy and Orion Birdsall stepped forward to host our new friends. Also, as previously arranged two members of the FF of Mundo Maya, Tuxtla Gutierrez, Mexico club joined us and were hosted by Dave and Linda Burns. Though not a regular FF journey, we treated our ambassadors as we normally would and had a hectic schedule for the week beginning on Sunday, October 22. That evening all of us were guests of the Mayor and Vice Mayor of Scottsville, Virginia who

threw us a welcoming party at the Scottsville Brewery, followed by a twilight tour of Scottsville which included period actors and actresses giving us an overview of the history of Scottsville. The next day we attempted a tour and guided hike of a trail off Skyline Drive, led by John Alluisi, with the group battling through fog and rain (ugh!) followed by a relaxing time at the Veritas winery. The rest of the week the weather cooperated and we were able to go on trips that included visits to Monticello, UVA in Charlottesville, the Governor's Mansion, State House, and Virginia Historical Museum in Richmond, the Frontier Culture Museum and downtown Staunton followed by a free day where our guests could sleep, shop and do whatever they wanted. Most, if not all of them also enjoyed boat trips around Lake Monticello thanks to several of our members. At the end of the week we had an informal "farewell party" at the Villages of Nahor, close to Lake Monticello where all of us, our guests, and two of our sponsored JAG students got together to say farewell to our new friends. What stands out at this event was that the two groups of international folks FFCV has contact with—FFI ambassadors and JAG students—were able to meet each other and see the two very different, though similar, cultural exchange programs FFCV is involved in. It was truly nice to see one of our JAG students from Afghanistan spending a lot of time talking with our Russian guests and our Korean JAG student spending time with them and our Mexican guests. As somebody said, this is what Friendship Force is all about. Again, thank you to all the hosts, day hosts, dinner party hosts, Patty Sclater (who coordinated the farewell dinner) and the rest of you who supported this effort!

2018 Inbound Australia:

The folks at FF Bundaberg, Australia have confirmed they plan on coming to visit our club on 2-9 October 2018. In the next couple of months we will be reaching out to the membership for somebody to be the "Host Coordinator" (HC) for their visit. We used to call this the "Exchange Director" or ED but apparently somebody took exception to that acronym. In any case, we will be looking for a member to take this position, so beware if you receive a call from me.

2018 Domestic Exchanges:

- As I wrote in the past expect one or more of these in the coming years. Our next domestic exchange will be will the FF of Des Moines, Iowa club which will occur in June, 2018, exact dates to be determined but will be a 5-day exchange starting mid-week. Again, watch out for a call from me looking for an HC for this journey. - For those of you who like to travel this could be interesting as for the first time in years we have requested two separate exchanges. Oopps I mean "journeys" as they are now called. And each is to a different part of the world.
- First is a return to Australia and New Zealand. The Australian club we hosted a couple of years ago, the FF of Sunshine Coast, has requested we visit them in 2019 as has the club in Marlborough, New Zealand. As such, given the distance involved we have asked FFI to include a third week in the region in either Australia close to the Great Barrier Reef or on the South Island of New Zealand. We will not know whether or not FFI agrees to this until around January but since both the Sunshine Coast and Marlborough clubs requested we be there and we told FFI we wanted to go this should work, but we'll see. More later.
- As noted earlier, the Cornwall, England club really wants us to visit them and we have requested a second 2019 journey which would include them and another club in Europe, which based on our membership survey would be Austria or Hungary. Again, no promises from anybody but think our chances of getting Cornwall and another place somewhere in Europe is pretty good.
- And of yes for those trying to figure all this out, we have requested a late October/November timeframe for the Australia/New Zealand journey and maybe May/June for Europe. Let's all keep our fingers crossed.



<u>Call to Order:</u> Chair Colville announced that a quorum was present the meeting and called the meeting to order at 3:10pm. All actions taken by the BOD were done upon motion duly made, seconded, followed by discussion, and carried by a majority vote of the Directors, unless otherwise noted.

President Report: President Al Coville reviewed the major events since the last BOD meeting.
