Open World Exchange

The FCCV has been selected to host an exchange involved with the Open World Leadership Center, an arm of the US Congress that focuses both on conducting exchanges that establish lasting professional relationships between the up-and-coming leaders of Open World countries and Americans dedicated to showcasing U.S. values and democratic institutions. Open World countries are those Eurasian countries that were part of the former Soviet bloc. FCCV will be hosting five members of parliament or other up and coming political leaders from the country of Tajikistan. They will arrive on November 4 and be our guests until November 12.

Though our itinerary is still not complete the activities in which we will involve the ambassadors includes almost two full days at the political center of the University of Virginia learning retail politics in the United States and observing the discussions of many influential people on election night as the results of the national election come in. We will also be visiting several municipalities in the area to meet with elected members of their leadership for panel discussions.

Tajikistan is also closely aligned with Virginia through military training and helping them develop drug interdiction programs. This training is provided by the Virginia National Guard.

2017 Outbound: Mondo Maya de Tuxtla Gutierrez,

Mexico: Good news! The Mexican club has confirmed the dates of the exchange and the number of folks they can host. The exchange will be held 18-25 April 2017 and our club will be allowed to send at least 10 ambassadors. We had hoped to have the exchange early in the month, but Easter will be late next year and a number of hosts and ambassadors would not be able to participate until after then. As for the number of ambassadors, we have 10 slots, as does the other U.S. club participating in the exchange, Des Moines, Iowa. At present we do have 10 members interested in filling our slots, but if Des Moines cannot fill theirs, we could add additional travelers. As previously reported Deb Winslow will be the ED for this exchange, if you have an interest in participating please contact her.

2017 Outbound: No change since the last newsletter. We are still hoping to establish an outbound exchange with Santa Barbara, CA in 2017 but this is still being coordinated. Other domestic exchanges may be possible. We are also talking with Medicine Hat, Alberta to see if we might be able to work out and exchange with them next year, more info on that in the next Ambassador.

2017 Inbound: Nizhny Novgorod and Kirov Oblast, Russia, November 2017: Nothing new has happened in regards to this exchange. As previously mentioned, we have let FFI know we have no

objection to hosting ambassadors from the two clubs and I have written to the EDs to work out details. More info to follow.

2017 Inbound: Themed exchange: As previously reported, FFI has requested we host a three or four day exchange sometime in 2017. We have suggested possible themes of “Central Virginia’s Early American Presidents”, “Wineries & and Micro Breweries of Central Virginia”, and “The Civil War in Central Virginia”. More details to follow in the coming months. We have yet to hear from FFI on this but will pass on the information once we hear from them.

2016 Inbound: Open World Program – Tajikistan

We are still working our way through defining what will be expected of our club in terms of hosting this event. To repeat, we will be hosting a small (7 or 8) delegation of folks from the country of Tajikistan who will be staying with us to learn about the electoral process here in the US. We envision this will include visits to local and state government organizations, possibly the University of Virginia, and other organizations involved in the electoral process. New member Bob Harris has agreed to act as Exchange Director for the exchange but we are in the process of putting together a committee of “seasoned” members to work out the details of the who, what, when, and where aspects of the exchange. Rob Beck has volunteered to work with FFI to learn more about what will be required. Information will be disseminated to the club membership as we work our way through this.

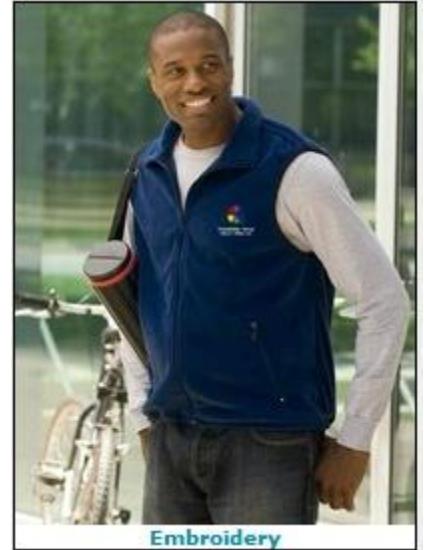

Call to Order: A quorum being present the meeting was called to order by Chairman Colville. All actions taken by the BOD were done upon motion duly made, seconded, followed by discussion, and carried by a majority vote of the Directors present unless otherwise noted.

Presidents Report: (Al Colville) Five (5) new members have joined the club. A new member Home Hosting program is in planning for some time in August. Details to follow. This program would be in addition to the planned year end meeting at which the events of the current club year will be reviewed for members and guests.

Secretary Report: (Margaret Dryer) No report or actions taken.

Club Operating Manual: The Secretary separately advised the BOD that she is awaiting the review comments from the Treasurer. He has been traveling.

Treasurer Report: (David Lea) No report,

June 2016 Financial Statements: Copies of the latest month club P&L had been provided to BOD members by email by the Treasurer in advance of the meeting. Mr. Beck suggested that in future monthly regular BOD meetings the financial statements for the club prepared by the Treasurer be reviewed and approved by the BOD. This would provide an official record of the evolving status of the club finances as well as an official source for information relied upon for government filings such as IRS Forms 990 and Virginia Annual reports. The BOD accepted the recommendation.

Club Bank & Related Accounts: As a result of the recent changes in club officers and directors, it was suggested that the Treasurer furnish the BOD members with a report identifying each bank or related financial account owned by the club (account name, account number, and location) together with an updated list of the signatories on those accounts.

Dee Schwagerl advised the BOD that she agreed to again act as the Treasure for all exchange programs approved by the BOD for the years 2016 and 2017.

Events Committee: (Peggy Colville, Chair)

June Mystery Dinner: Seventeen (17) people attended the event and all went well. It looks like an event that may be repeated.

July Event: Not yet settled. Could be attending a musical show together with a dinner. It would likely be at the end of the month. Peggy will follow up for interest and schedule the event if warranted.

August Event Luncheon for Freddie Bacher: A luncheon is being planned for August 15 at Noon at the Darden School. Dale Walden will interview her for the Ambassador. 20 to 30 people are expected to attend. The Darden School venue is a favorite of Freddy, fits with her schedule, and is available. Freddy has requested no gifts please. Linda Burns advised that the JAG School is planning to provide Freddy with a letter of appreciation for all her years of dedicated service to that program. It is expected to be presented at the luncheon. Linda will handle the details of this part of the event.

Year End Performance & Education Event: Al Colville led this discussion. He was following up upon past BOD discussions for the need of some event to replace the historic club member business meeting. Under our new incorporated status, there is no longer a need for that meeting. However, there is a continuing need to keep the BOD in active contact and communication with our members. Reporting on club performance at the most recent annual summer picnic events has been well received. It was agreed that this need must be met and that something more is needed to show the fine things the club is doing as well as help attract new members. A general discussion took place regarding just what the "Target Audience" for new members looks like and how can that Audience best be reached. The Audience appears to be more mature individuals and couples, who like to travel in social groups as well as receive people with similar interests as visitors to our community. They have historically best been reached through member, face to face, contacts. Follow up must support that member outreach to insure the biggest, best picture of FFI is presented. With the foregoing focus in mind, Al requested that all BOD members start to identify other members and others who might act as a committee to put this event together for November 2016. November 19 appeared to be a tentative event date. This need should be presented in the Ambassador and other communications sources. Among the suggested venues that present a social more than business feeling would be an event at a local wine tasting venue. While this will make November a very busy month, that appears to be the best, open month. It provides a time when most of the current year's events and programs have been completed; the 2017 Budget should be done or in final stages; and the weather should not yet be a major concern.

Exchange Program Committee: (Dave Burns, ED).

Civil War Inbound Exchange 9/28 to 10/2, 2016: (Bing Spitler, ED) Dave Burns reported that there will be a pot luck dinner on Thursday September 29th. Margaret Dryer has agreed to host that dinner at her home.

Open World Exchange November 4 to 12, 2016: (Robert Harris, ED). Dave Burns and Al Colville reported that Robert Harris has agreed to act as Ed for the exchange. Dale Walden agreed to join with Rob Beck on the exchange committee. They explained their knowledge of the expectations of FFI and the Tajikistan visitors. It was broadly described as a general knowledge of how our elections take place. That is why the exchange is taking place during the US 2016 Presidential Elections. No more detailed information has been provided to the club, including the backgrounds and more detailed expectations of the visitors. Rob Beck agreed to follow up with the FDI staff member (Elena McCarty) responsible for this exchange in an effort to get a more specifics. Al Colville will provide copies of his correspondence and contacts at FFI to Rob. All agreed that time to prepare for this exchange is extremely short and more club members are needed to join and help the exchange committee.

2017 Mexico Exchange Program: (Deb Winslow, ED). While there still appears to be an interest in doing this exchange, there is some interest in possibly seeking some more locations in Mexico to visit in addition to or in place of some of those currently on the table. Al Colville will discuss this with Deb Winslow.

2017 Iowa FFI Club Exchange: (???? ED). No details presented. It was reported that feedback from a Canadian club who recently visited Iowa was favorable. It appears that this possible exchange needs to be fleshed out in order to get it moving or stop discussions.

2017 Russian Inbound Program: (???? ED). The general discussion disclosed some concern that this should possibly not be just an inbound program but must have a real interest by club members to travel to Russia. There has been no follow up from the Russian side or from our side. Some resolution appears needed.

2018 Exchange Programs:. Al Colville and Dave Burns noted that there is a need to start a focus on what exchange opportunities the club may be interested in so as to get favorable place holders at FFI.

Membership Committee: (Dee Schwagerl, Chair). No report.

Fund Raising Committee: (Pam Hokanson, Chair)

Friday's After Five Program: The next event will be August 5, 2016 with the Friday's After Five program; Pam noted that under the new charity selection process the club will likely not receive more than two events a year. She raised the question whether just 2 events was worth the effort. A general discussion concluded that the changes to the selection system will not likely change, but that at least for the time being, the club should continue to offer to serve. In addition to the direct benefit to Charlottesville, it was good PR exposure for the club and a source of possible new members.

Corporate Sponsorship: Al Colville noted that under the new corporate/charity structure of the club, we can seek corporate or other sponsors as a new source of revenue for the club. Jason's Deli was used as a suggestion. A general discussion took place and the additional revenue could be used to offset person expenses incurred by members for exchange programs thereby making it easier to obtain volunteers for the events. It was agreed that a separate group of members needs to be created to focus on this area, set up a sales program, and administer the program. Al will present this to the membership as President as well as discuss this with Communications Chair, Walt O'Connell for information in future issues of the Ambassador.

JAG School: (Linda Burns, Chair). No new items to report. The program continues.

Outreach Committee: (Linda Burns, Chair). No new items reported.

Communications Committee: (Walt O'Connell, Chair). No report. Walt has set a deadline of July 9, 2016 for the next Ambassador. He is also working on a new, updated, club brochure to attract new members.

Next BOD Meeting: August 2, 2016 at 3:00 PM the Colville Home.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 PM
