Journey Committee

As previously noted, FFCV's 2019 Outbound Journey is a three-week visit to clubs located in Sunshine Coast and Bundaberg, Australia and Marlborough District, New Zealand. The dates for the journey have not been confirmed but are scheduled to start in mid-October and completed before Thanksgiving. Unfortunately, many of our members who had planned on participating in the journey are no longer able to do so, primarily due to health issues. If you have interest in this journey, please 4

let us know ASAP as our host coordinators need to know if we will be coming or if the journey will have to be cancelled. We really do not want to cancel the journey as we worked hard with the three clubs to get FFI to approve it, the Sunshine Coast and Bundaberg clubs have visited us in recent years, and all three places offer visits to highly popular locations. A little information is included below on each location; again, if you have an interest in participating please let us know.

The Sunshine Coast is located about 60 miles north of the state capital, <u>Brisbane</u>, in <u>South East Queensland</u> on the <u>Pacific Ocean</u> coastline, its urban area spans approximately 40 miles of coastline and hinterland. The estimated urban population of Sunshine Coast as of 2015 was slightly more than 302,000 making it the 9th most populous in Australia. The city encompasses beach resorts, surf spots and rural hinterland in southern Queensland, and stretches from the coastal city of Caloundra, near Brisbane, north to the Cooloola section of the Sandy National Park, home to multicolored sand dunes, mangrove forests, and shallow lakes. Upscale Noosa Heads has boutique shops, waterways, and walking trails through Noosa National Park.



Bundaberg is in south-east <u>Queensland</u>, Australia, about 240 miles north of the state capital, <u>Brisbane</u>. It is about 10 miles inland from the coast and situated on the <u>Burnett River</u>. Bundaberg is the business center for a major sugar cane growing area, and is well known for its namesake export, <u>Bundaberg Rum</u>. The city is an important tourism gateway for inland national parks and the southern end of the <u>Great Barrier Reef</u> and resort islands. Nearby on the coast is Mon Repos Regional Park, home to sea turtles, and offshore is Lady Elliot Island, part of the Great Barrier Reef. At Australia's 2016 Census population of the Bundaberg Significant Urban Area was about 69,000.



Marlborough is a region of New Zealand, at the northeastern tip of the South Island. It's well known for its winemaking industry, and the Marlborough Sounds, an extensive network of coastal waterways, peninsulas and islands. Blenheim, the main town in Marlborough, is situated in a large valley and with a population of just over 30,000 people. Picton is smaller but, being at the head of the Marlborough Sounds is an important port hosting a number of cruise ships annually. Marlborough is a rapidly expanding wine region, our Sauvignon Blanc becoming world renowned and giving rise to a large number of wineries and their vineyards. An even bigger industry is that of mussels, prolific in the sheltered bays of the Marlborough Sounds. To a lesser extent, there is cattle and sheep farming, some orchards and forestry. The climate is moderate.






